Motion was made by Mr. Davis, which carried 5:0, to adopt the following resolution:

**A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF
STATE TRANSPORTATION CONSTRUCTION FUNDS**

WHEREAS, Virginia's transportation system is critical to economic competitiveness; and

WHEREAS, localities along Virginia's Golden Crescent play a significant and key role in Virginia's economy; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Virginia is unable to fully meet its transportation needs; and

WHEREAS, by 2017 the Commonwealth of Virginia will have no state construction funds, will be unable to fully match federal funds, and will have insufficient funds to maintain its existing transportation system; and


WHEREAS, \$500 million in capital improvement funds in Virginia's Transportation Trust Fund are taken each year to support Virginia's Highway Maintenance and Operating Fund.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the New Kent County Board of Supervisors does hereby support a collaboration between the Mayors and Chairs of


Virginia's Golden Crescent localities and the Virginia General Assembly to assess short- and long-term maintenance and capital needs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Kent County Board of Supervisors hereby requests the Virginia General Assembly to take all necessary and immediate actions to stem the flow of capital improvement funds from the state's Transportation Trust Fund to the state's Highway Maintenance and Operating Fund and to develop a comprehensive plan to meet statewide maintenance needs and Virginia's Golden Crescent capital improvement needs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Kent County Board of Supervisors hereby requests that the Virginia General Assembly take all necessary and immediate actions to prevent and/or mitigate the financial forecasts for 2017 as previously outlined.
