Motion was made by Mrs. Ringley, which carried 5:0, to adopt the following Ordinance:

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 10-63 OF THE
NEW KENT COUNTY CODE TO REQUIRE OWNERS OF
DOGS RESIDING IN NEW KENT TO OBTAIN A DOG LICENSE**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of New Kent County:

1. That §10-63 of the New Kent County Code is hereby amended and adopted to read in its entirety as follows:

Sec.10-63. Obtaining license; displaying receipts.


Any resident of the county owner or caretaker of a dog animal owned, possessed, or kept within the county shall may obtain a dog license by making oral or written application to the treasurer of the county, accompanied by the amount of the license tax and current certificate of vaccination as required by this article. The treasurer shall only have authority to license dogs of resident owners or custodians who

reside within the boundary limits of the county *or the owners or custodians of kennels located within the county* and may require information to this effect from any applicant. Upon receipt of proper application and current certificate of vaccination as required by this article, the treasurer shall issue a license receipt for the amount, on which he shall record the name and address of the owner or custodian, the date of payment, the year for which issued, the serial number of the tag, the word "dog", whether male, unsexed female, female or kennel, and deliver the metal license tags or plates provided for in this article. The information thus received shall be retained by the treasurer, open to public inspection, during the period for which such license is valid. The treasurer may establish substations in convenient locations in the county and appoint agents for the collection of the license tax and issuance of such licenses. Dog *or kennel* license receipts shall be carefully preserved by the licensees and exhibited promptly on request for inspection by the animal control officer or other officer.

2. That the provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and the unenforceability of any provision in the Ordinance, as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction, shall not affect the enforceability of any other provision of the Ordinance.

3. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
