

A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEW KENT WAS HELD ON THE NINTH DAY OF JULY IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED NINETY IN THE BOARD ROOM OF THE COUNTY OFFICE BUILDING.

IN RE: RESIDENT ENGINEER'S REPORT

As Staff was determining the required actions to be taken due to lack of quorum of the Board of Supervisors, the Chairman called on the Resident Engineer to make his report.

Mr. Hawthorne reported that the Highway Department was receiving comments concerning holding a public hearing on Route 611 until July 20, 1990. Anyone wishing to make comment should contact the Resident Engineer's office prior to that date.

Comment was made by Mr. Robinson that it could save a considerable amount of money if a public hearing was not necessary. This was confirmed by Mr. Hawthorne. Mr. Hawthorne stated that they would be receiving bids on July 24, 1990 for the next phase of improvements on Route 627. They anticipate the start of construction in September. Mr. Hawthorne also stated that work would begin on the overlay of Interstate 64 from Route 155 to the James City County line this week and that the work would be performed only at night until Labor Day, after which time the construction would proceed on a 24-hour basis from 12:00 Monday until 12:00 Friday.

Mr. Ringley stated that he had had several inquiries concerning a reduction in the speed limit on Route 613.

Mr. Hawthorne indicated that he would review the traffic count for Route 613 as well as the current speed limit.

At this time Mr. Ringley recognized Mr. Rudolph Jones, Supervisor of Charles City County, and Mr. G. G. Crump, New Kent County School Board Member, and welcomed them to the meeting.

IN RE: ELECTED OFFICIALS' REPORT

Mr. Ringley stated that he had received a letter from the Office of the Governor relating to the shortfall of revenues for the biennium 1990-92.

Mrs. Marianne Powell, Director of the New Kent County Social Services Department, reported to the Board that she has been required to change her fiscal year accounting period to begin June 1 rather than July 1 and that they were currently determining where budget cuts would be necessary to meet the anticipated shortfall.

IN RE: LACK OF QUORUM

At this time, the Chairman officially determined that there would be no quorum of Board Members for this meeting. Following a discussion, Mr. Robinson requested that the Board Meeting be rescheduled for the following evening to conclude the business on the agenda with the exception of Items 3 and 4 which would be rescheduled for the August Board Meeting. Upon receiving this request, the Chairman adjourned the meeting until 7:30 p.m., July 10, 1990.
