Volunteer with Quin Rivers; offer gifts, talents, interests

According to a study by the Center for Disease control, every minute, 20 people become victims of intimate partner violence. Volunteer research has shown that the number one catalyst for people becoming involved in volunteer service is a personal connection and with such a staggering statistic, there is a chance that this cause could fall closer to home than you think. One way to help survivors or current victims of intimate partner or domestic violence is to support the programs and advocates that serve victims. Project Hope offers a variety of opportunities for volunteers, organizations, and businesses who wish to give of their time and talents to support survivors. Not sure where you fit in? Lee Ailstock our Volunteer Coordinator offers three questions to consider and assist you in determining what type of volunteer position is best for you:

1. What type of time commitment can you make?

Coming up with the time between work, school, kids, or other obligations can be difficult. Project Hope offers a variety of opportunities for volunteers to engage with our programs and support the survivors in our community. Opportunities range from Done-In-a-Day Projects, to administrative support in our office and direct client support. Training requirements vary by project and assignment, but for those seeking to volunteer and have direct client contact, volunteers need to complete a 30-40 hour training course. Once completed and accepted, volunteers are able to assist in such areas as childcare, our children's summer camp, and more.

Don't have that much time to dedicate? Positions which do

not require intensive training include things like helping with special events; tabling and helping to spread the word in the community about our services, data entry and administrative work; hosting a drive for items on our wish list; hosting your own fundraiser, and more.

2. What are your gifts, talents, or interests?

Lee Ailstock, our Outreach and Volunteer Coordinator works one on one with volunteers during placement to ensure that all volunteers are placed in roles that they are interested in and comfortable with. Although we have specific volunteer roles and activities, we always encourage volunteers to explore their own areas of talent and interest and think creatively how they can use them within the program. Examine your strengths — are you detail oriented and well organized?

Maybe you can help in the office filing paperwork or planning an event. Are you good with children? You would be great at helping with childcare during events or workshops. Maybe you're a writer — survivors might benefit from help writing a resume to begin a new job search or volunteer to do an expressive journaling workshop.

3. How far are you willing to drive?

Distance can be one of the largest barriers for maintaining committed volunteers. It is important to consider how far you can reasonably commit to traveling before committing to volunteer with an organization. Project Hope serves a sprawling rural community that stretches over five counties. With many of our volunteer opportunities comes the likelihood of travel. We want to ensure that our volunteers

are made aware upfront and are comfortable with the possibility of driving to participate. This not only includes your commute to and from the office but to events around our service area.

Speaking of volunteers, Quin Rivers' volunteer tripartite Board of Directors will be undergoing a Board of Directors' Retreat in February 2017. Quin Rivers strongly believes in continuing education opportunities and providing volunteers at every level with the support necessary to enhance their skills sets for the betterment of the communities we serve.

Fuel assistance deadline approaching — apply soon

Applications are now being accepted for the Virginia Department of Social Services' (VDSS) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Through Monday, November 14, individuals may apply for fuel assistance at all local departments of social services and online.

The Energy Assistance Program, funded by the LIHEAP block grant, provides funds to states to assist low-income households in meeting their home energy needs. The program assists eligible households with the costs of home energy

sources including electricity, natural and liquid propane gas, oil, kerosene, coal and wood.

“LIHEAP provides a basic human need,” said Margaret Ross Schultze, Virginia Department of Social Services Commissioner. “Without this program, thousands of Virginians would be vulnerable to freezing temperatures, unable to heat their homes.”

To qualify for Fuel Assistance, the maximum gross monthly income for a one-

person household cannot exceed \$1,287. For a household of four, the maximum gross monthly income is \$2,633. Last year, nearly 120,000 households received assistance.

Families and individuals can apply through their local department of social services office. To apply online or to check eligibility for services visit the CommonHelp website at: <https://commonhelp.virginia.gov/access/>.

You completed a broadband survey from the County... and now what?

We thank you for participating in the broadband survey! Approximately 22% of households completed and returned the survey to the County or completed the survey online.

The information provided is very valuable to us and to the consultant that conducted the study for us. The consultant said that 22% is the highest response he has seen to date - so, just like voting and recycling, New Kent residents care and are active in their community and it definitely shows!

We anticipate that the Board of Supervisors will receive a report on the broadband project from staff in November. The project, which will take two to three years for completion, consists of a feasibility study (the survey you completed) as well as a plan for New Kent County to construct a wireless broadband infrastructure.

It has not been expected that this process will be completed overnight, but in phases that will depend on available federal and state grant funding such as the grant the County received last October. New Kent was one of four counties to receive \$75,000 as part of the Virginia Telecommunication Planning Initiative Grant program. This program provides funding to localities to develop community wide broadband plans, which involve market research, engineering design, and development of a business model for the implementation of a new broadband system.

New Kent seniors: Chickahominy Area Triad needs your feedback

The Chickahominy Area Triad, a partnership between the Sheriff's Department, our local government, senior service providers and New Kent and Charles City seniors is currently forming to help ensure the security and well being of the senior population in our community. A survey to determine the needs of our seniors is a necessary part of that process. If you are a senior (age 60 or older) please help us out by completing and returning a survey.



Surveys are currently available at the Information Desk of the New Kent County Administration Building and will soon be made available to your church as well as other local organizations. You may also obtain a survey by emailing Pat Armbrust at ateachur@aol.com.

NKC Public Schools news: quarterly update

New Kent County Public Schools are off to a great start and believe it or not we will be about a fourth of the way through the 2016-17 school year by the time you receive this newsletter. We have a number of areas of focus this year that I want to share with you in this newsletter. To begin, we have spent a good amount of time examining our student enrollment trends and space utilization. It is certainly no secret that we have very full elementary schools and a tight middle school is on the horizon. NKCPSS currently has approximately 3,100 students, which is roughly 100 more students than we had last year. I believe New Kent County is a wonderful community with great schools, which is going to continue to attract new residents. To that end, the School Board and Board of Supervisors recently held a joint meeting and are actively discussing our next steps to ensure we have strong school facilities for New Kent students in the years to come.

In addition to facility needs, we are continuing our work around the instructional framework. Our instructional framework document, which can be located here http://www.newkentschools.org/about_nkcps/departments/instruction, is what drives how we teach and learn. I highly encourage you to check it out, but if you can't, the gist of our teaching and learning philosophy is that we have the best teachers teaching students through student centered activities that goes well beyond basic comprehension. Our students are constantly learning through six skills that include critical thinking, problem solving, research and information liter-

acy, collaboration, communication, creativity and imagination. What else is exciting is that we have added wireless technology and Chromebooks in grades K-12 to allow students to routinely utilize these skills through modern, 21st century research, collaboration, and product creation tools.

Our third focus this year is the development of a comprehensive plan to ensure our students are college, career, and life ready after high school. This includes providing a wide range of courses including dual enrollment, Advanced Placement, and career and technical education options. All students will have the opportunity to earn an industry credential in order to better position them for the workforce and secondary education. The plan will also include students taking career inventories and exploring different career options in middle school through high school leading students to make informed decisions regarding their future. We are looking further into internship options and exposure to occupations within our community and region. The comprehensive plan also includes access to a small engine technology course at Bridging Communities Technical Center, as well as a new regional coding and computer science school. To prepare our students for future success, there is also an emphasis on soft skills such as teamwork and diversity awareness, effective speaking and listening, as well as life-long learning skills to further personal growth. Of course, these options only scratch the surface of the comprehensive plan we are working toward. Ultimately, the goal is for students to have two transcripts of which one measures their course completion and grades, while the other outlines the skills and exposure they have had to prepare them for anything they want to accomplish after high school.

I hope you have enjoyed gaining a better insight into what we are focusing on in New Kent County Public Schools. I also encourage you to check out what our students do outside of the classroom. We have dozens of sporting events every week that New Kent residents can attend, along with upcoming winter music concerts, and theatrical performances. Lastly, I encourage you to follow me on Twit-

ter (@NKCPSSupt). I like to highlight special things we are doing through Twitter and it will be a place I give updates to school weather closures and other important matters. I can't say it enough. I am blessed to work with such an incredible group of students and staff in NKCPSS! I hope you have a great Fall!

Fall Foliage Flight Festival overwhelming success

As the beautiful young lady sang the last verse of the National Anthem acappella, a low rumble could be felt more than heard approaching from the east. Several hundred pairs of eyes searched the sky expectantly. Very soon a diamond formation of North American AT-6's appeared in tight formation with the lead airplane trailing smoke. Timing was precise, as the warbirds crossed directly overhead on the last note of the Anthem. The power and the beauty of these six hundred horsepower WWII airplanes impressed every viewer. With this exciting flyover the New Kent County Fall Foliage Flight Festival began.

It all commenced this past spring when the airport manager reached out to the airport tenants and friends in an effort to "rally the troops" to promote economic development and support such an event for the airport and county. Monthly meetings, soon to become biweekly meetings, were held to orchestrate the event. Many ideas were presented, shared and adopted and over time perfected. Committees were formed and Susan K. Burbaker opted to accept the role as Chairperson. The group was to become known as the New Kent Flyers. So many volunteers helped, led by Airport Manager Duane Goss, that it would be impossible to thank them all without the accidental oversight of some.

One of the initial tasks was to obtain sponsorships and businesses approached were more than eager to support the event. Due to the overwhelming willingness of support, this task was soon accomplished in short order. The contributing sponsors were: New Kent Economic Development; Francisco, Robinson Realtors; The Club at Viniterra; Providence Forge Hardware; Delta Airport Consultants; Richmond Jet Center; James River Equipment; Gary Green Advertising; New Kent Flight Center and The New Kent Flyers.

It was estimated that the five to six hundred visitors over the period of the day, found that there were things to see and do from one end of the airport to the other. They were informed regularly of scheduled events via announcer and public address system. There were UAS (unmanned aerial systems-drones) flight demonstrations by Tidewater Drones and RC (remote

controlled) aircraft flight demonstrations.

New Kent County Fire and Rescue EMS had a presence of personnel and vehicles as was the New Kent County Sheriff's Department. The Virginia State Department of Aviation attended with their mobile unit to promote aviation. In addition, a state sponsored aircraft attended to promote state activities. Quinton Fire and EMS Auxiliary provided an outstanding food concession for all.

Local vendors were present and displayed their goods for the public within the airport's main hangar. And of course, there were many aircraft to witness take flight including Piper J3 Cubs, home-built experimentals, aerobatic biplanes, War Birds, Stearmans, a Fairchild F24, LifeEvac Helicopter and manufactured aircraft just to name a few. More than two dozen visitors flew in from surrounding airports.

A flour-shower and marshmallow drop were two activities demonstrating piloting skills and drew great interest from the crowd. Visitors had an opportunity to purchase numbered marshmallows that were later dropped, en masse, by a Piper J3 Cub over a target area. And what a shower it was, two hundred marshmallows blanketed the sky. The closest to the

center of the target shared a cash prize.

In addition, pilots taking turns from a safe altitude aimed for the target with bags of flour for the flour-shower. Again, the closest to the target shared a cash prize.

Other happenings throughout the day included children's activities graciously provided by the youth minister for Journey Christian Fellowship Church and Safari Coffee. A great opportunity to earn a Boy Scout Merit Badge in Aviation was offered and three scouts were awarded their badges.
